Margret Hoppe is a master student of Timm Rauert's at the Hochschule für Grafik und Gestaltung in Leipzig. Her exhibition "Erinnernde Bilder" (engl. "remembering pictures") cast a light on rememberance and dealing with the Communist past in Germany and Bulgaria. In Eastern Germany, she researched the whereabouts of paintings that disappeared after the turnaround in 1989. The disappearance of these paintings left blank spaces behind which indicate the gradul fading of rememberance.

In Bulgaria, she documented the change in the meaning of monuments on the basis of the slowly decaying memorials and statues that were erected in Communist times.

On December 11<sup>th</sup>, writer, journalist, and stage artist Falko Hennig from Berlin read from his book "Alles nur geklaut" (engl. "Everything was stolen") as well as from essays and diary excerpts.

On December 13<sup>th</sup>, the IECG invited cultural scientist and historian Evelina Kelbecheva from the American University in Blagoevgrad who specializes in Bulgaria's dealing with the visible Communist heritage such as monuments.
